'Des Arbres' Attractive In Fine French Motif

Superior Construction Company selected the oak shaded corner of Briargrove and Barton Hills Drives as the site for its Parade home, then appropriately gave it a tree-shaded French name, "Des Arbres" in keeping with the fine home's French Provincial styling by architects Duane J. Myers & Associates.

To further the French motif, the company sought the help of decorator Laoma Freund and George G. Blair of Sears-Roebuck & Co.

Constructed of flaked-white brick, trimmed with beige shutters and eaves, and completed with a cedar shingled roof, the U-shaped floor plan greets visitors with a wrought-iron fenced courtyard and large front door with flanking frosted glass panels and decorative sun-burst.

From here, guests are ushered into a terrazzo foyer enhanced by French blue and white provincial wallpaper.

The foyer immediately opens into a formal carpeted living room and adjoining dining area. From here, louvered doors lead to the home's kitchen with vinyl, moulded cabinet tops, builtin range, oven, disposal unit and sheet vinyl flooring.

And, the sunny breakfast room is an invitation to linger over that last cup of coffee, as you look out into the home's tree shaded yard with its large, exposed aggregate patio and porch.

In all, the air conditioned home has three bedrooms and two terrazzo floored baths with tile vanities. A distinctive feature of each bedroom is the moulded, gold and white wooden ceiling trim . . . an extra



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touch of fine craftsmanship. The master bedroom has an enclosed corner shower, walkin closet and natural wood finished linen closet.

Another thoughtful feature of "Des Abres" is the extra parking space provided for a boat in the home's two-car garage which, by the way, has a side-street entrance.
