'Radcliffe' Emphasizes English Manor Style

"Radcliffe," as its name indicates is a brick, English manor style home constructed by Puett - Duncan and associate builder B. T. Webb.

The home's exterior immediately imparts a feeling of luxurious comfort so traditional to English styling, yet greatly improved in quality by American ingenuity and modern techniques.

Furnished and decorated by Karotkins, "Radcliffe" will be long-remembered by Parade visitors for its beauty and practical zoning.

A broad driveway is interrupted midway to the home's detached, double garage with a wrought iron gate and brick fence. The garage is linked to the house with a formal portico that ends in a covered back porch and terrace. The garage, by the way, has extra room for a workshop and boat parking.

Visitors to "Radcliffe" will find themselves greeted in a bricked Tudor foyer just off the carpeted living room with its 9-foot bay window and adjoining formal dining room.

The exposed beam, paneled family room has a brick wall that ends with a corner, oval fireplace and elevated hearth. From here, a curved serving bar with drop-cabinets and ornate plate-rail, fades into the kitchen and all the "most wanted" builtin appliances and features.

The home's breakfast room, we think you'll agree, is the kind in which you can relax in smiling comfort . . . no matter how early the hour. Its pleasant decor is enhanced with a broad bay window overlooking the terrace and garden.

And, there's more, much more comfort to be found in the "Radcliffe" east wing of four large bedrooms and two full baths.
